This month we have a special treat in receiving a wonderful article from a local long time AA member:

Campfire Circle Group remembrances

In my diary, the day of the first meeting, June 5, 1998, I wrote:

"Tonight is the first meeting of the Cacapon Group of AA. Outside meeting in the state park."

That entry was June 5, 1998.

The next day, June 6, 1998, I wrote:

"The Cacapon meeting was nice. Paul K, Bob D, Dan K, Louie (new-comer), Smitty, and Barbara, a lady who moved here from Philly a few months ago."

The above were the folks at that first meeting.

I assume that either the original folks called it the Cacapon meeting or Cacapon Group or that's just the way I chose to write it back then in my diary. At some point, likely within a year, the official name was adopted and registered at the General Service Office in New York: "Campfire Circle Group".

Bob D. (known in our AA circles as "spiritual Bob"), was the cook at a local restaurant. If the group had a single founder, he would be it though I don't think that was ever explicitly stated, and he was humble enough that he would have shunned that designation.

(I was excited about being one of the folks at the first meeting. I was involved in the talk about starting the meeting. I was the only one who had experience in starting an AA group. It's nice to think that I played a role).

Paul K is an oldtimer who worked at a local resort. He and his AA wife moved to Martinsburg some years later. Paul was trying to help Louie,

who was drinking pretty heavily. His whereabouts after he left his local job are unknown.

I'm almost completely certain that Smitty was the AA member who was well known in Berkeley Springs as the "town drunk." He was in and out of sobriety over the years. His drinking was kind of "legendary" in that folks would wonder how he could continue to drink so very hard, get sober, and repeat this cycle so many times, and not die. Some years later, he did die.

Barbara was a good AA who got sober in Philadelphia and was a regular at the campfire meeting for a number of years.

If I remember correctly, the campfire circle where we continue to meet today is the location of the first and the subsequent meetings in the warm weather. I do not recall whether we met in the boat dock shelter or "gazebo" on rainy Fridays, though the boat dock shelter has served that purpose for many years now.

One of the original locations of the meeting during the cold months was the United Methodist Church south of the park at 522 and Oakland Road. I don't recall if that was the location for more than one year. There were some very cold Fridays when there were only two or three folks at the meeting. Several times it was just me and Frank G (who got sober just a bit after the group started and was one of the anchors of the group for many years. (He now lives in Pennsylvania and gets up around 3:00 AM to go to work, so he has not been able to attend regularly for some years now).

The church provided us with different rooms in the church, some of them quite small (almost closet-sized!), but no one ever complained! After some months, the church hierarchy changed a number of their policies, and gatherings in the church when there were no church officers on the grounds were discontinued. I believe that it was at this time, though I'm not sure, that we approached the staff at the State Park to see if they would rent us a room for the cold months. This might have been after another very active AA member,

The State Park regulations were such that they could not officially rent rooms to us, but an arrangement was made wherein the group could make donations, and in an informal exchange, the staff would let us meet in one or another room in the main lodge. Perhaps misunderstood by some AA members even today is that the donations we provide (two times a year, in the past) do not guarantee a room or guarantee the Campfire Circle or boat dock shelter location for us on any given Friday. The group has no "rights" to any location but are only provided the space as a courtesy if there are no other groups reserving the locations. This has very rarely been an inconvenience. The State Park has been incredibly accommodating to the group over the years.

A really delightful and pleasant, though perhaps a bit quirky, fellow AA named Harry constructed the red and white signs that are (still, I believe) set out every Friday. This was many years ago). They have held up so well! Harry left the area a number of years ago, along with the tiny trailer he often had behind his car (and lived in!). Our hats will always be off to Harry and his great work!

Of course the group gets larger as weather improves and smaller as it gets colder. Never, in my recollection, has there been a time when the meeting was cancelled for any reason.

There is so much wonderful sobriety and experiences over the years that is not documented here, Frank G is still around and I have asked if he would be willing to add to the history
